AGAINST FOOTBALL RACISM

Messages of support and solidarity have been left on a mural of footballer Marcus Rashford. These messages will now be preserved.

Hundreds of notes which support Rashford were placed on his image after it was damaged by vandals, following England's Euro 2020 final loss to Italy. The messages from Rashford's fans were placed to cover up the damage on the wall art which is located in Withington, Manchester. **1.** _____ Ed Wellard, who ordered the mural, stated that a final decision had yet to be made but the notes and messages would be "kept and if possible displayed".

Swear words were written all over the mural shortly after Rashford missed a penalty in the 3-2 loss to Italy on Sunday. **2.** _____ The three players were also victims of racist abuse on social media after the game.

Marcus Rashford is a forward who plays for England and Manchester United. However, outside of football, he is known for his campaigns to fight with child hunger. Rashford said he was sorry for missing his penalty and that he "wished it had gone differently". **3.** _____ The Manchester United forward also said he was "lost for words" as hundreds of people gathered for an anti-racism demonstration at the mural on Tuesday evening. People took the knee at the Stand Up to Racism demonstration and several speakers spoke to the crowd of around 700 people.

Greater Manchester Police have started an investigation after they received a report of damage which contained racial abuse at the mural. **4.** _____. A 37-year-old man, from Trafford, has since been arrested.

A The mural was painted after Euro 2020 to celebrate Rashford.

B He also thanked to all those who added the supportive messages to the mural.

C A social media post which was directed at the England players on Sunday is also being investigated.

D However, Akse, the street artist who created the portrait, has now repaired the damage.

E The game left the English football fans unhappy and disappointed with the loss.

F Marcus Rashford, Jadon Sancho and Bukayo Saka all missed their spot kicks in the final.
